London in context

- Demographics
- Vision
- Mission
- Key front-line activities



Political context

- Change of government
- Shift in the balance between central control and devolution
- Too much standardisation
- Too little innovation
- Too little direct contact with offenders



Changes in LPT's environment

- Breaking the Cycle - consultation document
- Shift away from performance targets
- Increased power to public sector providers
- Significant budget reductions
- Increased competition and plurality of service providers
- Increased power to local government



Response to localism agenda

- Establishment of 23 Local Delivery Units (LDUs)
- A more integrated approach to service delivery
- A more targeted response to complex and diverse needs
- Borough offending profiles



Work in Prisons

- Current prison population in excess of 85k
- Payment by results
- Targetting the right offender group
- Role of seconded probation teams
- Sentence planning board
- Early identification and assessment
- Use of Approved Premises as a Psychologically Informed Planned Environment (PIPE)



Integrated Offender Management

- Total Place - whole area approach
- Shared performance indicators
- Reducing Reoffending - priority for all
- Shared assessment frameworks
- Offender engagement
- MAPPA
